










Cumulative excess deaths since 2020, by year






High anxiety: GB vs pre-pandemic (Wales)





COVID-19 hospitalised cases by acquisition type, 7 day rolling average, all persons, all ages, Wales, 07/03/2020 to 09/01/2023
















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
Percentage of patient pathways waiting over 36 weeks to start treatment by health board, Wales, 01/2017 to 11/2022



Excess mortality


'Excess mortality' is where there are more deaths than would be expected in a given month. The number of expected deaths is the count of deaths by month, averaged across a previous five-year 'comparator period'. For example, in the chart below, there were 232 more deaths in June 2022 than in the comparator period (the average of October 2016-21, excluding 2020). Conversely, in January 2022 there were 402 fewer deaths than expected.


Excess mortality excluding COVID-19, difference between the number of deaths in the current and comparator period*, Wales, 01/2020 to 11/2022



* 2015-19 mortality is used as a comparator period for 2020 & 2021. 2016-21 (excl 2020) mortality is used as a comparator for 2022.


Excess mortality

Age-standardised excess mortality is measured as the difference between the observed and expected age-standardised death rate for a given month, where the expected death rate is calculated for a five-year 'comparator period'. Age-standardised excess mortality can be expressed as either the difference in rates (chart above) or percentage difference in rates (chart below). For example in the chart above, in February 2022 for diabetes, the death rate was 22.9 per 100,000 higher than in the comparator period. Expressed as a percentage difference, this equated to a 24.9% increase for that disease and period.















Please take caution when interpreting the personal wellbeing charts as the data compares two different areas and comes from two separate surveys - Annual Population Survey (APS), Wales & Opinions and Lifestyle Survey (OPN), Great Britain. Although the questions and response options are the same, the survey sample size and data collection methods differ. The APS has a sample size of approximately 13,000 and has a combination of face-to-face and telephone where as the OPN has a sample size of approximately 2,000 and is primarily completed online.


Real median monthly earnings annual growth rate in Wales, seasonally adjusted, and UK CPIH annual inflation rate, 01/2017 to 11/2022

90/10 income inequality ratio*, UK, 01/2017 to 11/2022










Economic inactivity by reason, percentage, persons aged 16-64, Wales, 01/2017 to 11/2022 (rolling 3 month ending)






